Superintendent's Report

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Munro reported attending the Bay Federal sponsored Bite of Reality event at Soquel High School with other Rotarian volunteers. Students participated in an assigned life and budget activity. The Superintendent also shared photos from the Santa Cruz High Band Review where school bands participated in a day of competition with visiting schools from across the state. She also joined students from each high school at the Interact Fall Leadership Conference. Further, she attended Rebecca London's book launch on <u>Rethinking Recess</u>, which was based on research on recess in our elementary schools. The Superintendent reported on the second Tech Cadre training, which provided K-8 teachers technology training from the CS for

All Grant. The Superintendent joined classified staff and union members at the annual ABC Unified West Coast Labor Management Conference. She spoke about the PGE public safety power shut offs, which affected a number of SCCS schools and the District office. She commended facilities, schools, teachers, principals, and support staff for maintaining schools without power and internet. The Superintendent announced that the district will be transitioning from its current student information system Illuminate. As the majority of districts in the county need to replace their Illuminate student information systemthe COE Chief Technology Officer is facilitating a selection process and will work to leverage contract and professional development costs on behalf of all districts.. Lastly, Superintendent Munro publicized that the December Board meeting was moved to the 18th due to new legislation that requires that the annual organizational meeting be held in a specific window in December.

Board Member Threet participated in a CTE Biotech class as a judge for a debate. Students were engaged and well versed, and she was pleased to see minds at work. Ms. Threet invited the community to attend the Soquel High "stump" football game on Friday at 7:30pm. She thanked the Board for acknowledging the field needs so that students can participate.

ITEMS TO BE TRANSACTED AND/OR DISCUSSED

8.6.1.1. <u>New Business: New Boundary Map for the Elementary District</u>

Assistant Superintendent Parks presented the recommendation to approve a new elementary attendance boundary map for implementation with TK/K students in 2020. The Elementary Redistricting Committee was formed in response to the Elementary Declining Enrollment Task Force's recommendations to address declining enrollment. The committee convened on three occasions, during which the public was invited to attend. At the final meeting, members voted on the solution which best met the new boundary consideration criteria. Staff thanked committee members and made recommendation to the Board to approve

Map Solution 4. Staff also recommended that the new maps be implement in fall 2020 for TK/K students, and that all current families will continue to attend their current schools, including siblings not yet enrolled. Trustees asked questions and had discussion about the process of public involvement and opportunity for input. There were no public comments.

MSP (Coonerty/Perez-Granados) 6-1, the Board of Education approved the new elementary attendance boundary map for implementation of TK/K in 2020.

8.6.2.1. Staff Report: LGBTQ Task Force Report

Student Services Director Atlansky and Director of the Safe Schools Project Ron Indra presented an update on the LGBTQ Task Force. Formed in 2016-2017, the task force is a collaborative partnership that supports LGBTQ students and families of Santa Cruz City Schools. This group of educators and community members work in collaboration to increase awareness of current LGBTQ issues with regard to curriculum, climate, policy, and resources. Staff presented on accomplishments and goals for the coming school year. This report was informational in nature and the Trustees took no actions on this matter.

8.6.2.2. <u>New Business: Curriculum Master Plan Budget and Executive Summary</u>

Curriculum, Intervention and Assessment Director Hodges presented an update on the Curriculum Master Plan (CMP) Budget and Executive Summary. The Master Plan, informed by stakeholder input, is a guide academic and social emotional learning for the next five years.. Staff presented a three-year budget to address the components of the master plan. In addition, staff outlined a plan to address Board members' request for ndesignated funds for teacher requested professional development opportunities that support innovation. Trustees asked questions and had discussion. Staf recommended approval of the three-year CMP budget.

Public Comment: Helayne Ballaban commented that she was pleased to see the Calkin's Unit of Study purchased in the third year. of the master plan.

MSP (Vestal/Ranii) 7-0, the Board of Education approved the Curriculum Master Plan Budget and Executive Summary.

8.6.2.3. <u>New Business: Local Control Accountability Plan Local Indicators</u>

Assistant Superintendent Coito reported that the California School Dashboard contains both State and Local Indicators. For Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) priorities where data is not collected at the state level, a Local Education Agency (LEA) must measure and report its progress through the Dashboard based on locally collected data. The Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) local indicators are as follows: basic conditions at school; implementation of State Academic Standards; parent engagement; local climate survey; access to a broad course of study. The local indicators reflect the emphasis on "local control", help to create a seamless accountability process throughout state and local levels and allow the local community to understand the complete picture of an LEA's progress. For each of these local indicators, Santa Cruz City Schools has compiled evidence to substantiate meeting the criteria for each indicator, including site facility reports, evaluation of instructional materials, master schedule offerings, completion of social emotional health surveys and "Healthy Kids" surveys and parent attendance at school and district meetings. **Public Comment:** Student Services Director Gail Atlansky commented that she has been working with Encompass and NAMI regarding risk assessment and mental health, and she can provide the Board an update in the future.

MSP (Coonerty/Vestal) 7-0, the Board of Education approved the Local Control Accountability Plan Dashboard Local Indicators.

8.6.3.1. Staff Report: Preliminary CBEDS Report 2019-20

Assistant Superintendent Parks reported that the California Basic Educational Data System (CBEDS) is an annual data collection administered the first Wednesday in October. This year CBEDS information day was October 2. The purpose of CBEDS is to collect demographic information on students, faculty and district employees. The District as a whole has decreased enrollment from 2018-19 to 2019-20 by 53 students. The Elementary District (grades Pre-K – 6), including Bay View, DeLaveaga, Gault, and Westlake, AFE (grades K-6), Monarch, increased enrollment by 2 students from last year. The Secondary District (grades 7-12), including Branciforte and Mission Hill Middle Schools, Harbor, Santa Cruz, Soquel, Costanoa High Schools and ARK and AFE (grades 7-12) decreased by 55 students. Trustees discussed how program placement may be impacting enrollment.

Public Comments: Bay View teacher Helayne Ballaban expressed concern that the SAIL program was affecting the campus.

Teacher Matt Bruner expressed that he would not participate in a program that may attempt to win students from other schools or districts.

Band Booster President John Owen expressed his feeling that schools with incentive programs are an important resource to build curriculum and make it more accessible to students.

8.6.3.2. <u>New Business: Resolution 11-19-20: Grant Application for Funding by Zero-Emission Transit,</u> <u>School and Shuttle Bus Project</u>

Superintendent Munro presented Resolution 11-19-20 to apply for a grant from the Zero-Emission Transit School and Shuttle Bus Project. Transportation Supervisor Emil Frates identified this grant resource from Volkswagen Mitigation Trust Funds The grant is awarded on a first-come-first-served application process under the Zero-Emission Transit, School and Shuttle Bus Project, administrated by San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District.

Dr. Coonerty motioned to approve the resolution, and Ms. Threet seconded the motion. Resolution 11-19-20 was approved by the Board of Education by the following Roll Call Vote:

8.6.5.1. <u>Staff Report: Parcel Tax Ballot Measure</u>

Superintendent Munro updated the Board on Parcel Tax Ballot Measures for the elementary and secondary districts. On September 25, 2019, at the Board Parcel Tax Study Session, the Board received a report on poll results for consolidating and renewing the four existing District parcel measures. These measures provide more than 8% of the District's revenue and ensure critical programs for our students. Dr. Tim McClarney's presentation on poll results illustrated wide-spread community support for the programs that our measures currently fund. Trustees reviewed the second draft readings of two Board Resolutions to put two measures on the March 2020 ballot. These resolutions will be brought to the Board for action on November 6, 2019. Trustees requested an updated version of the resolutions to be sent upon completion, before the next Board book.
