▶ A Home for Educators

K&L will allow our district to provide 100 units **of reduced-rent housing** to district teachers & staff, helping us continue to recruit & retain amazing staff to serve students and families during our national teacher shortage.

The project is planned for the lot already owned by the district at 100 Swift Street (Between Gateway School and Derby Park). Now in the final stages of design, we hope to break ground in the near year & open in 2028!
